- Always follow instructions on the packaging
- Keep water close by as a precaution
- Never give fireworks to small children and keep children at least 10 feet away from the firework area
- Be aware of your surroundings and never aim fireworks towards people, animals, vehicles, structures, or flammable material
- Never relight a firework that didn't go off
- Fireworks are not allowed to be discharged in city parks
- Follow local and state laws and regulations
